## **2020 General Election One-Stop Early Voting Schedule Locations, Dates, and Hours**

Early voting begins on October 15 and ends on October 31.

## One-Stop Early Voting Information

- Any registered voter in the county can go to any early voting site during this period and vote; on Election Day, voters should go to the polling place they're assigned to, which is based on where they live in the county.
- If necessary, a previously registered county voter can update name or within-county address during one-stop early voting. Party affiliation cannot be changed during early voting.
- Same-day registration, the process of registering and voting at a one-stop early voting site at the same time, is available during the early voting period.
  - If an individual misses the traditional registration deadline (October 9 for the 2020 general election) and has resided in Stokes County for at least 30 days prior to Election Day, they may go through the same-day registration process at an early voting site.
  - Documentation that includes the person's current name and address will have to be shown to an early voting worker. Options include driver license, other government photo ID, a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, etc.
  - **Same-day registration is available during early voting; it may not be done on Election Day itself.**
  - **Voter registration does not transfer from another state or another North Carolina county. Stokes County residents must complete a new registration form upon moving to the county.**

- As described above, individuals may update their name or address on an existing Stokes County voter registration at an early voting site, or new registrants may go through the same-day registration process. **However, individuals are encouraged to submit a voter registration form (to register for the first time in the county or update existing information) to the Board of Elections prior to the early voting period.** The traditional registration deadline is October 9.

- Photo ID is not required for the 2020 general election.
